Senior and Social Security Issues – from Congressman Quigley's office

Elli Song from Congressman Quigley's office is the office's case worker who handles Social Security and Medicare issues. Prior to joining the Congressman's staff, Ms. Song worked in the senior services industry. Ms. Song appeared in front of the SLN membership to let us know that if you are having problems with your Social Security or Medicare issues, such as medical expense reimbursement or prescription drug issues, name, address or other informational issues or just need some advice on how to work your way through the system and cut through the red tape, feel free to contact the Congressman's office for assistance.

Ms. Song also gave us a quick coaching session on Medicare Part B and D. At 65 years old, you are automatically enrolled in Medicare. However, you have a window of 3 months before you turn 65, 1 month during your birth month and 3 months after your birthday (3-1-3) to enroll in Medicare Part B for service and supplies to treat your health conditions and Part D-drugs before you are penalized a yearly increase of 10% on your premiums for signing up late. Chicago Cubs Neighborhood Relations

Ms. Heather Way-Kitzes, Manager of Cubs Neighborhood Relations goes on an annual Spring tour of the local neighborhood groups to update the neighbors on what's happening at Wrigley Field. Heather noted that the 5-year construction plan is complete. The inside of Wrigley Field, the Zachary Hotel across the street and the Cubs headquarters at Clark and Waveland are all open. Not financially related, but Heather announced that Cubs Manager Joe Maddon's new restaurant Maddon's Post is now open at the SE corner of Clark and Waveland. Will Maddon be distracted during games getting menu change texts during a game?

Gallagher Way Programming outside of Wrigley has morning, Game Day, evening, weekend and special events almost every day. Most of them are free. Go to The Gallagher Way website for event details. Ludacris (not free) appeared on June 1. Send me a review if you went.

Heather let the members know that the Cubs are involved in the safety of the neighborhood with the Cubs funding their neighborhood security plan called "Safe at Home." The plan features community policing provided by off-duty law enforcement on neighborhood streets during specified overnight hours and non-game days. The Cubs have donated over \$1 million to expand the City of Chicago's network of cameras within the boundaries of Lake Shore Drive. Montrose. Western and Belmont. The Cubs are also dedicated to litter and trash removal around Wrigley. The Cubs created the Neighborhood Grounds Crew where nearly 200 volunteers collected more than 179 bags of trash and recycled 2,200 pounds of trash.

The Cubs and Cub Charities continue to support and donate to Community Affairs with donations to Lake View High School, Blaine and Agassiz Grammar Schools, Gill Park and the 19th District Police Station and others.

Heather did bring some Cubs swag, that I believe will be raffled off at the July 9 SLN Summer Party.

Farm Bar – request for extension of Sidewalk Café hours

The Alderman's office was contacted by The Farm Bar to extend its outside sidewalk patio café operations. That information was given to SLN after the May meeting agenda was set. SLN members were notified of the issue by email or Facebook. According to information given to President Sam Samatas, Farm Bar believes they have been a good business neighbor, that there have been minimal number of area complaints of its' operations and therefore requested the patio operation time extension. Currently, the sidewalk café hours are Mon-Fri from 5-9PM and Sat-Sun from 11AM-9PM. They are looking to expand the hours to Mon-Fri 11AM-10PM and Sat-Sun 10AM-10PM.

No representative from the Farm Bar was present at the SLN Meeting. The floor was open for discussion. The neighbor immediately next to Farm Bar commented on Farm Bar's claim that there have not been many complaints regarding the sidewalk café. The neighbor noted that living right next door to the operations of a sidewalk café as opposed to in the middle of the same block is very different. Talking is loud. People waiting to be seated hang-out in front of the restaurant. Uber drop-off traffic is increased. The kitchen's large. loud fans would be going almost all day long. And finally, the neighbor commented that though closing of the patio is currently 9PM, there are many times people are still wrapping up their meals then and clean-up of the patio occurs after that. The neighbor two houses from Farm Bar supported the neighbor's claims. The neighbor also noted that they have an extensive parkway garden and the expanded patio hours severely limit when gardening could be done with patrons sitting there almost all day long. Comments from others noted that while SLN has been very supportive of the various street cafes and patios, they are all on major streets and Farm Bar is in a residential neighborhood and that needs to be strongly considered.

A hand vote was taken.

The vote results were forwarded to Alderman Waguespack.

EPILOGUE:

Elizabeth Gomez-Director of Business and Community Affairs emailed to SLN President Sam Samatas that Farm Bar has agreed to close at 9PM Sunday through Thursday and 10PM on Friday and Saturday. They will also be allowed to extend day hours for lunch service (as presented at the SLN meeting).

Sam Samatas responded to the Elizabeth Gomez by email regarding the Alderman's decision as follows:

"Thanks for your involvement. Here is all I have to say- 1) I am glad and so are you that we do not live near the café and feel bad for those that do, especially during mid-day hours. 2) This is a SF, RS3 or RT3.5 residential area, not Lincoln/ Wellington/ or Southport. It is just logical that café hours should be more curtailed vs. those on busier streets. Owners knew this when they opened there. 3) I love outdoor cafes and seeing folks enjoy themselves, just not on a quiet residential street. SLVN is not feeling the love, especially after such a lop-sided advisory vote.

Victor Guistino- neighborhood Chicago historian

Victor Guistino gave his 2nd annual historic rampage of facts to the membership. Victor sits on stage, reads off his hand-written notes and adds tidbits to his written notes.

Some of the information:

- The town of Lakeview bounded by Lake Michigan, Western Ave, Fullerton and Montrose was incorporated into the City of Chicago in 1889.
- The original Lakeview jail was at Byron and Clark and that building has a plaque on it denoting that.
- Riverview Amusement Park existed from 1905-1967. (I could see the parachute ride from the 3rd floor of St. Andrew Grammar School when I was in 3rd grade).
- Walt Disney, who lived on the northside of Chicago as a child, spent many hours at Riverview Amusement Park before coming up with the Disneyland idea.

- Adolph Hitler's nephew lived in Ireland, immigrated to the U.S. and was an anti-Hitler supporter here in the U.S.
- Demon Dogs hot dogs, formerly under the Fullerton L stop was owned by a member of the band Chicago.
- The Japanese community that was released from internment camps after WWII, first settled on north Clark St., eventually moving up to the Wrigleyville area. The Nisei Bar located at 3439 Sheffield (nisei means "2nd generation Japanese immigrant") was the center of the Japanese community at one time.

Victor Guistino holds a Masters Degree in Cultural Studies, has given over 500 tours of the City of Chicago and was the winner of Crain's Chicago Trivia Contest.

State Rep. Ann Williams – Report from her Office

Our State Rep. Ann Williams has been busy down in Springfield, so her Chief of Staff Emily Melbye was going to update us on the legislation. However, at the last second, Emily had to also get down to Springfield. Ms. Williams sent us a legislative update. Here is a summary of legislation and her positions:

Graduated Income Tax – would replace Illinois' antiquated flat tax and would follow the approach of a vast majority of states. It would take the form of a Constitutional Amendment which the voters would decide in the 2020 general election. It is still under discussion and unclear how the top rates will be structured. Ms. Williams states that data shows that 87% of taxpayers will see no change in their taxes and some will receive a modest tax break.

Reforming Illinois property tax assessment system and Cook County Assessor Fritz Kaegi's commercial property tax reform proposal resulting in a lower burden on home owners property taxes.

Revenue streams under discussion -

Legalization of cannabis – under 21 would be prohibited from consuming cannabis and cannabis could not be consumed any place where smoking is prohibited. A \$20 million low interest loan program could be created for communities most impacted by the "war on drugs" to ensure they

could participate in and benefit from the legal cannabis marketplace.

Wagering on sports betting being considered: #1 proposal allows sports betting on riverboat casinos, horse racing tracks, off-track betting parlors, video gaming operators and the lottery. #2 proposal would delay companies such as DraftKings from securing their own licenses initially, but would permit licensing after a period of time.




