AT THE OCTOBER 2021 MEETING

SLN is planning on continuing IN-PERSON LIVE meetings in the near future. In order to promote social distancing, SLN intends to hold all the meetings in the big auditorium at the Athenaeum when that space is available. At the Tuesday, October 5 meeting, there was a scheduling snafu, as The Lakeview Symphony Orchestra was having practice in the big auditorium. SLN pivoted and held the meeting in the smaller 1st floor space. All in attendance including the speakers kept their face masks on during the meeting. Thanks to the members for their understanding and flexibility.

U.S. Congressman Mike Quigley

Washington, DC. conducts its normal business during the 2nd week of the month, so for many years, the Congressman was not able to attend the

SLN monthly meetings. Due to ZOOM meetings during the pre-vaccine months of the Pandemic and now with SLN moving the monthly meeting to the first Tuesday of the month, the Congressman has been able to present to the membership on a regular basis.

The Congressman started out by telling the members that his office has been operational and is open for assistance relating to Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security and Veteran Benefits. He alerted us that if we have an expiring passport to get started on renewing it. He said there is a huge 6-8 month back-log in processing new and renewal of passports.

The Congressman related how the various programs initiated during the Pandemic kept the economy moving along. He sighted the government assistance for live theater venues such as The Vic Theater and the Aragon Ballroom that has allowed them to remain in business and now finally reopen. He noted that the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP loans) that helped businesses keep their workforce employed and stay open during the Pandemic was put together in nine days by our elected officials.

Regarding getting vaccinated, the Congressman noted how we are already required to be vaccinated for various diseases (measles, mumps, polio, tetanus of a total of 14 various diseases). He commented on how various pandemics have been around before, such as SAARS which was more deadly but less transmissible than COVID-19. He referred to the development of the current vaccines as a brilliant human effort. So, get your vaccination.

January 6 Capitol Attack – Congressman Quigley was in the House of Representative when the attack occurred. As a member of the Committee on Intelligence, the Congressman strongly believes that the January 6 activities be fully examined. He believes that the investigation will unearth information and ideas to protect the U.S. democracy in the future, similar to the results of the 9/11 attack that changed how America lives. He stated that democracy is fragile and cited a recent poll where 25%-30% of the people polled think that the Democratic from of government is not the best and should be replaced with an Authoritarian form of government.

Raising the Debt Ceiling – the debt ceiling is a legislative limit on the amount of national debt that can be incurred by the US Treasury, thus limiting how much money the Federal Government may pay on the debt already borrowed. The Congressman stressed the importance on raising the debt ceiling in order for the government to pay its current obligations such as Social Security payments. By not voting in favor of raising the debt ceiling, he felt the Republicans are messing with USA's credit rating which would have severe economic ramifications.

Infrastructure Plan (\$1 trillion) and Reconciliation Plan (\$3.5 trillion) over 10 years — without going into any detail as to what the plans contain, the Congressman said the need for the passing of these two budget items as "not traditional" but needed for the current economy. He compared the Plans to President FDR's social programs during the Great Depression and President Eisenhower's interstate highway system bill as "not traditional" plans that forever changed the U.S.

The Congressman opened up the floor for questions and here are some issues that were addressed:

Post Office operations – the Congressman is having a Federal meeting in the near future. He claims the U.S.Postal Service got caught in a whirlwind of employees not coming to work or having to watch their school children who were remote learning due to the Pandemic. In addition, the Post Office did not see the change from the Post Office having equipment being letter oriented, which is decreasing year after year, and not having package-oriented equipment which increased during the Pandemic.

International vs. Domestic Terror Threat –

The Congressman contends that the Domestic Threat is now greater than the threat of International Terrorism. He sighted the lack of shared information as part of the January 6 Capitol Attack issue. He is currently working on funding intelligence and getting all the Agencies on working together.

Afghanistan – the Congressman felt that if the withdrawal had been done five years down the road, the results would have been the same due to the corruption of the Afghan Government and Military, despite being trained by the best the U.S had to offer. He stated that the U.S is going to need

help from Pakistan, other neighboring countries and even Saudi Arabia with intelligence in the future.

The final comment from the Congressman was that what keeps him awake at night is how polarized the Country is. He feels that President Biden is trying to bring people in the U.S. back together again.

Cook County Commissioner Bridget Degnan

Commissioner Degnan has been a regular guest at SLN meetings since being elected three years ago. She always gives an energetic talk and says she could talk all day because she loves her job. She started out by asking how many people in attendance had ever called her office for any type of assistance. Maybe two or three members raised their hands. She said her office is here to help constituents because all politics are local, so don't be hesitant to call, regardless of the issue.

She was proud to announce that the County passed a \$8 billion dollar "balanced" budget without any new taxes or fees. The County will receive \$1 billion dollars from the federal government American Rescue Plan Act. Ms. Degnan plans to direct as much of that \$1 billion to our District for infrastructure, schools and after-school programs for at-risk students. She commented that the County is funding its pension obligations better than any other branch of government in the State of Illinois.

Property Taxes – as elected Cook County officials are in charge of generating our property tax bills, Ms. Degnan said her office could help if we have any questions about our property taxes, like are we getting all the exemptions available (senior, homeowners, etc). She said her office could also assist in an appeal.

Crisis Intervention (911) – The County is rolling out a Crisis Intervention Team in conjunction with 911. 911 calls that are not crimes, such as mental health issues, will be diverted to the Intervention Team

and not the police. The Team will push the people to related services that will help them, not to jail. She sited Cook County Sheriff's claim that the majority of inmates in the Cook County Jail suffer from mental illness.

Environment – Ms. Degnan sits on the Environment Committee. The Committee is working on allowing residents to plant natural gardens in the parkway area in front of their houses which improves water retainage and increasing the County's tree canopy for oxygen production and climate control issues. In addition, the County is looking to increase industrial composting from restaurants or food processing operations to turn food waste into usable compost instead of filling up our garbage landfills.

Some questions from the Membership generated the following comments from Commissioner Degnan:

Solar power – the County does currently have a plan to incorporate solar power into its buildings or new building requirements.

Converting State vehicles to electric (EV) - she in on the Forest Preserve Vehicle Fleet Committee and is working on converting the fleet from gas to electric.

Government Agencies – she acknowledges the need to consolidate the overabundance of small local agencies to save money.

Noise and light pollution - the Cook County Forest Preserve has a very progressive plan in this area.

County Bike Trails – a member commented that the bike trails have been redone and are great condition

CRIME – though not totally a County-only issue, she said this is a hugely complex issue that cannot be solved in TV sound bites. Programs like the Crisis Intervention will take years before the effects can be seen. She is not in favor of the bail/bond changes that occurred last year. She does not believe electronic monitoring is working in the taxpayer favor as dangerous criminals are being let out.

Commissioner Degnan's final comment was to vote in all elections as they do matter. She urged the membership to align our elected officials with our ideals.

RESTAURANT REVIEW – by Maria B

Gotham New York Bagel and Eats, 2801 N. Lincoln.

Since so many restaurants are still not seating due to the Pandemic, I decided to try a 'pick up or delivery only' restaurant to visit. I have been eyeing Gotham Bagel/Eduardo's Enoteca. They split the former Gino's East restaurant into two completely different restaurants with shared space. Gotham has the early hours, 8am to 2pm, then Eduardos takes the late shift. Today we ordered from Gotham New York Bagel and Eats, 2801 N. Lincoln.

They only take online orders, so I familiarized myself with their website. I saw that the first available pick up or delivery was one day out. Too bad, we were looking forward to bagels in the morning. So we'll wait. I also learned that Gotham donates a portion of their proceeds to the Chicago Food Depository, and easily allows you to add a donation to your cart. Nice.

We found some delicious choices. At least a dozen different breakfast bagel sandwiches. The 'Brighton Beach' was their take on lox and bagels. We picked a bacon, egg and cheddar bagel sandwich, and some bagel chips. Their coffee had to be sampled also. They have some limited offerings from their deli, but we were disappointed to see they were out of pastrami. So we ordered breakfast for pick up and prepared to wait for the text to let us know it was ready.

The text never came on the appointed day. A half hour after my pick-up time, I decided to go in, and

there was my order sitting on the counter. Explaining my disappointment that I didn't get a text, the worker replied "well I hit the button." Trying not to be too annoyed, I took my food and my luke-warm coffee and went home.

The good news is that the food was delicious. The 'Brighton Beach' was a great rendition of lox, cream cheese, tomato, onion and capers on a toasted bagel. The bacon, egg and cheddar bagel was perfect. Each sandwich's pickle was exceptionally yummy. Sampling the huge variety of bagel chips, each one was more flavorful then the last. And the coffee, even microwaved, was full and robust.

The prices at Gotham are a little high but not unreasonable. We will return for a 'Brighton Beach' and a chance to sample pastrami from their deli. GothamBagels.com




