State Senator Sara Feigenholtz – Legislative update

State Senator Feigenholtz contacted SLN and requested to present to the members results of recent legislation and highlights from the 2023 State Budget

From the Senator's handout:

Budget Highlights:

State made an additional \$500 million above this year's average pension payment reducing future costs by \$2 billion.

State deposited \$1 billion to the Rainy Day Savings Fund.

Legislation Highlights:

Illinois Family Relief Plan:

Property tax relief- homeowners credit, maximum \$300.

Grocery tax suspension - for one year to help families struggling with inflation.

Gas tax suspension – State's portion of sales tax suspended for six months.

Crisis Mental Health & Addiction Response: \$5 million in funding for the new 9-8-8 Crisis Response hotline for people experiencing a mental health crisis.

\$50 million increase in addiction treatment.

Public Safety & Violence Prevention: Additional funding to hire and train 300 new State troopers

\$30 million for camera grants to local enforcement \$20 million for license plate reader cameras. The Senator was especially excited with this issue

Additional Relief for Hospitality \$75 million for the Hotel Jobs Recovery Grant Program \$50 million for restaurants, bars and breweries \$50 million for independent live venues

Car Emission Testing – the State Senator passed a bill to restore emission testing back within the Chicago City limits so we don't have to spend a whole driving and waiting in line up at the testing center in Skokie.

State Senator Sara Feigenholtz's – letter to Crain's Chicago Business – "Abortion is still legal. As of today, it remains your constitutional right." The Senator handed out of letter she had published in Crain's Chicago Business. The letter referred to Illinois protecting the right to an abortion in the State of Illinois by passing HB40 and the Reproductive Health Act. Those bills eliminated a trigger law and ensured abortion was a fundamental right in state law.


