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At the MARCH 2022 MEETING –

Mayoral Run-off Candidates – Drop in

SLN's Co-president Sam Samatas worked hard contacting and recontacting the Run-off Mayoral Candidates Paul Vallas and Brandon Johnson. In the end, shortly before the scheduled SLN meeting, the candidates had to decline as they had to attend a larger forum at UIC. Both candidates appeared at the Special SLN Mayoral Meeting in January. With Co-president Bob Blitstein, Sam and Bob were still able to toggle together an energetic monthly meeting.

Congressman Mike Quigley

Congressman Quigley was called back to Washington D.C. and could not attend the March Meeting. Yoni Pizer, Community Liaison for Congressman Quigley, stepped in for Mr. Quigley.

Yoni is familiar to the SLN membership as a frequent attendee at monthly SLN membership and ZOOM meetings over the last several years as a representative for the Congressman's office.

Yoni began by noting that the Congressman was on a boat heading to an undisclosed destination. The Congressman is a member of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence and as a member, he is briefed daily about the threats facing our country.

Yoni informed the membership that the 5th District has been redrawn and now runs from Navy Pier in Chicago northwest to Lake Barrington. The 5th District basically follows the Northwest Metra Line train route. 40% of the constituents in the 5th District are new.

Appropriations Funding

The deadline for 2023 applications for Community Funding Projects appropriations was ending on Friday March 17. Yoni said 100% of the Congressman's 2022 appropriation requests were successfully funded, but commented that the Republican controlled House of Representatives has cut this year's appropriations in ½.

Public Transportation

Quigley is a member on the T-HUD Committee (Transportation, Housing and Urban Development) and he and Senator Durbin are working on the

\$350 million funding to extend the Red Line Rapid Transit line on the South Side.

Ukraine

The Congressman is a member of the Congressional Ukrainian Caucus. Yoni noted that the 5th District has the highest Ukrainian population of any Congressional District in the U.S. Quigley has met with President Zelensky in Kyiv and believes that the Ukrainian battle is a U.S. battle.

Bank Failures

Yoni addressed the recent bank failures in the Silicon Valley stating that these failures are very different than the 2008 bank system collapse. The banks involved are rather small measured in net assets and collapsed due to Silicon Valley tech issues, Crypto currency investments and bond investment issues. He noted that these bank bailouts are not a taxpayer bail-out but paid by fees paid by banks pursuant to the Dodd-Frank Act that came out of the 2008 failure. He concluded that the overall banking industry is strong.

National Debt Ceiling and Default

Based on a question from the membership, Yoni commented that Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen indicated that unless the Debt Ceiling is increased, the U.S. Government will default by the Summer. Yoni commented that a bi-partisan solution is required or potentially severe consequences to the U.S. economy could occur.

Travel

Yoni alerted all to check their passports if you are traveling abroad in the next year. He stated that the State Department is overwhelmed with new and renewal passport requests as a result of the increased travel due to the easing of Covid-19 travel restrictions and the pent-up travel demand. If your passport is expiring within six months, you should get it renewed now.

Post Office issues

Yoni declared that they just received a Christmas card post-marked December 2022. We have all experienced erratic postal delivery service. He recommends you register your complaints to Congressman Quigley's website so the issues are documented. The Congressman is working on removing the Head of the USPS, but it is not that easy as the USPS serves its Appointed Board of Governors and the U.S. President cannot just fire him.

Update from the Office of State Senator Sara Feigenholtz

Our State Senator sent Samantha Biel from her office to give SLN a quick update from the most recent General Assembly in Springfield.

Just like Congressman Quigley, the State Senator's District 6 was redrawn and now runs northwest from the Hancock Building to about Lawrence and Sacramento Avenues.

Electric Vehicle (EV) charging

State Senator Sara has sponsored the Electric Vehicle Charging Act legislation to require new single-family homes and multi-unit residential buildings to include basic infrastructure for EV charging. The legislation is an effort to combat climate change, reduce vehicle emissions and expand the market for EV's.

Crime – expressway shooting and stolen vehicles

Our State Senator obtained \$1.4 million in funds for the purchase and installation of Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) technology for the Chicagoland area. Samatha gave some short stats on the effectiveness of the ALPR's and distributed a letter from Brendan F. Kelly, Director of the Illinois State Police. Here are some highlights from that letter.

Two years ago, Illinois and the Chicagoland area in particular faced a sharp increase in shootings on the expressways.

- 1) ALPRs capture a visual of vehicle license plates and anytime a wanted or suspected vehicle is detected by an ALPR, an alert is

issued and law enforcement are better able to locate and track the vehicle.

- 2) ALPRs installed on Interstate highways: 2021-100, 2022-289 to be installed in 2023-50.
- 3) The Illinois State Police also expanded its Air Operations Unit. The Air Operations enable effective and safer pursuits by allowing units on the ground to modify high-speed pursuits while Air Operations continues to track fleeing vehicles from air.
- 4) The combination of the ALPRs and Air Operations resulted in decreases from 2021 to 2022 of 264 to 140 for shootings, 119 to 60 for injuries and 24 to 3 for deaths. Traffic stops increased from 14,378 to 25,676. The combination of the strategies also resulted in a 70% increase in guns recovered and a 230% increase in the recovery of stolen/hijacked vehicles.

Residential Solar Energy presentation

The SLN membership and the Board have been mulling over the idea of getting some general Solar Energy info to the membership. So, a reputable and local solar energy company was invited to the March meeting.

Wind Free Solar rep Jack Johannson addressed the membership. Wind Free has been in business since 2009 and has installed over 600 jobs. They are strictly a local company, installing only in Illinois and are experienced in dealing with ComEd.

Mr., Johannson indicated that the State of Illinois is probably one of the easiest States to go solar in the U.S. Currently, there are State and Federal incentives to go solar, thus reducing your initial and

on-going costs. The process begins with a “feasibility study” based on your current electric bill and an analysis of your house’s access to adequate solar rays. If the feasibility study is positive, an on-site visit is done to get a roof assessment of your house and any repair or upgrade requirements that might be needed.

Mr. Johansson listed out some reasons to go solar:

- 1) Grid resiliency when the grid has a blackout.
- 2) Reduce your carbon footprint.
- 3) Saves money by producing your own energy and
- 4) Increases your property value

SLN By-law changes

The SLN Board has worked on modernizing the By-laws starting back during the Summer of 2021. The edited By-Laws were posted to the SLN website. SLN Treasurer Geoff Gass reviewed the major changes with membership being proposed including:

- 1) To allow remote voting if a ZOOM Meeting is required.
- 2) Allows a new member to vote immediately on voting issues (replacing the 60-day waiting period).
- 3) Eliminated the position of 2nd Vice President.
- 4) Revised the out-dated restrictions on how the Nominating Committee operates.
- 5) Quorum reduced to 20 from 24.
- 6) Removal of Officer or Director – “An Officer or Director may be removed for cause if a two-thirds majority of the Board of Directors approves the removal. The person subject to removal for cause must be given notice of the vote at least 30 days before the meeting at which the vote will occur.”

The By-Law changes were opened to the floor for discussion. There was an objection to the Removal of Officer or Director provision by former SLN President and former Director David Duggan. Mr. Duggan noted that this provision would be an unprecedented move and an infringement on the members’ ultimate control over the organization. Mr. Duggan has noted in a posting to SLN’s

Facebook page that “Under Robert’s Rules of Order” which has been the rule book by which SLN has run its affairs, it is the membership that can remove a board member, not fellow board members.” Mr. Gass noted that the SLN by-laws state that “All matters NOT GOVERNED by these by-laws shall be determined by Roberts Rules of Order” (Article VII-Meetings, Section 4). At that point, Bill Haderlein, former SLN President and current Board Member, commented that a volunteer organization where Board Members commit many hours of their time to the SLN Organization and neighborhood issues needs a provision to remove a Board Member that is disruptive and disrespectful to other Board Members and the Board Meeting process. He strongly supported the adoption of the proposed By-Law changes. Mr. Gass then proceeded to list similar provisions that appear in SLN’s neighboring Community Associations By-laws, some with only a 50% vote.

A motion was made to vote. The result:

28 YES in favor, 2 NO against. The By-law changes were adopted.

The NDRC intends to review proposals that will be comparable with the nearby zoning. This land comes under the Transit Oriented Development (TOD) area and is open to a fairly dense project with minimal required parking spots.

Dear Senator Feigenholtz:

I am pleased to share with you an update on Chicago area expressway violence and to thank the General Assembly for playing a critical role in giving the Illinois State Police the tools we need to continue to make our expressways and nearby communities safer. As a result of increased enforcement efforts and new technology, the total number of Chicago area expressway shootings dropped 47 percent in 2022 compared to 2021. The number of non-fatal injury expressway shootings in the Chicago area was cut in half, and the number of expressway homicides decreased by 88 percent compared to last year.

Two years ago, the residents of our state, and the Chicagoland area in particular, faced a sharp increase in shootings on the expressways. This phenomenon, which had never before been seen at this level in Illinois, resulted in 264 shootings and 24 homicides in 2021.

The Illinois State Police responded to this crisis with an agency-wide mobilization to develop and implement innovative strategies to fight the violence. These strategies included additional Troopers and Special Agents, Air Operations, and forensic services. ISP engaged in preventive policing resulting in a 70 percent increase in guns recovered and a 230 percent increase in the recovery of stolen/hijacked vehicles in the last year alone.

ISP Statewide Anti-Violence Enforcement (SAVE) unit, Chicago Anti-Violence Detail, and District Chicago Patrol – Expressway violence and enforcement 2022 statistical comparison to 2021:

One key to turning the tide of expressway shootings was the support of the General Assembly in funding and authorizing the use of Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) technology which has had a direct impact on ISP's ability to target and track criminal activity. Shooters can no longer count on being anonymous! An ALPR captures a visual of vehicle license plates; and anytime a wanted or suspected vehicle is detected by an ALPR, an alert is issued and law enforcement are better able to locate and track the vehicle. In 2021, ISP installed approximately 100 ALPRs along I-94. By the end of 2022, there were 289 ALPRs installed along I-94, I-90, I-290, I-294, I-55, and I-57. In 2023, ISP will continue to install ALPRs on expressways in and around Chicago with an additional 50 ALPRs along I-94 and I-55

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planned to finish the first phase of the Tamara Clayton Expressway Camera Act. An estimated \$20 million is also appropriated for additional ALPRs in 22 counties across the state, which include Cook and surrounding counties.

Another strategy increasing the effectiveness of ISP enforcement was the expanded use of our Air Operations unit. Air Operations enable effective pursuits and help make pursuits safer by allowing units on the ground to modify high-speed pursuits while Air Operations continues tracking the fleeing vehicles from the air. This allows units on the ground to pre-position themselves to stop a subject vehicle. During 2022, ISP Air Operations missions directly resulted in 123 arrests, including 52 carjacking arrests and 7 armed robbery arrests, as well as 107 vehicles and 38 weapons recovered. In the coming year, we will continue to work to secure funding to replace our aging aircraft and secure additional patrol vehicles to maintain this mission.

In 2022, ISP's efforts to identify, locate, arrest, and charge suspected offenders resulted in more violent offenders being held accountable compared to 2021. The number of cases charged in 2022 increased by 140 percent compared to 2021. The ISP Division of Criminal Investigation coordinates closely with the Cook County State's Attorney's Office to ensure cases are charged in a timely manner.



Just one example of the success of ISP's multi-resource, coordinated approach occurred in mid-December when ISP responded to a call of an individual shooting at another vehicle while traveling on I-94. Officers were able to identify the suspected vehicle using ALPRs, enter it into the Law Enforcement Agencies Data System, and locate the vehicle at the registered owner's residence. While conducting surveillance, ISP took the suspect into custody. The suspect later confessed. In executing search warrants for the residence, ISP Special Agents found multiple fraudulent IDs, 40 rounds of ammunition, and a fully loaded magazine. A search of the vehicle also resulted in finding a gun. The suspect was charged with Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Aggravated Discharge of a Firearm, and Possession of a Firearm with a Revoked FOID. It took less than 24 hours from the time the crime was committed to charges being filed. This is but one example we are at liberty to share, and an example of the kind of quick enforcement occurring now on a more regular basis.

In 2023, ISP will continue to utilize this multifaceted approach that has shown results in reducing violent crime on our expressways, including an increased interdiction-focused ISP Statewide Anti-Violence Enforcement (SAVE) Unit, multi-jurisdiction collaboration, a unified command of varied ISP divisions focused on expressway violence, increased use of ALPRs, and Air Operations.

Again, I want to thank the General Assembly for working with the Governor to provide the resources and technology that have allowed the hard-working men and women of the ISP to make Chicago-area expressways safer. There is much more yet to be done as we pursue justice and protect public safety, so we look forward to continued cooperation with you to protect the Illinois motorists who daily travel our expressways.

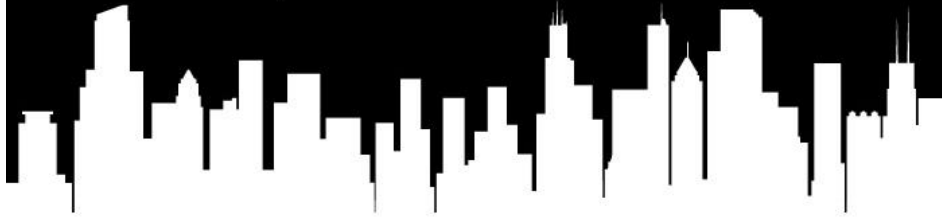

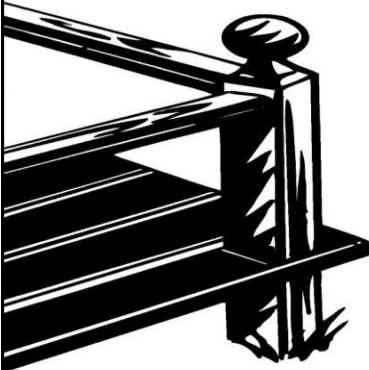

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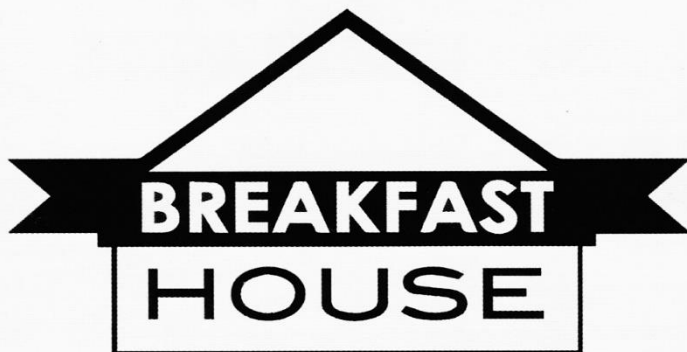
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
