A very belated "Happy New Year" to all of South Lakeview. I hope everyone had a peaceful holiday, and I must mention the wonderful holiday party we had at Will's Northwoods in December. Great food, great company and a fun raffle with numerous prize winners and over \$700 in

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proceeds going to Friends of Burley School. As I write, I am bundled up due to a couple of weeks of super frigid temperatures and a few rounds of snow. It seems like it's 50 one day and 10 below the next. These weather extremes point to climate change and its impact. Stay tuned and be well-prepared.

On March 17 Chicagoans will be voting in primaries to determine candidates for the November 2026 midterm elections. On Wednesday, Feb. 11 at 7PM South Lakeview Neighbors will be holding a forum for candidates running for Cook County Commissioner of the 12th district, Cook County Assessor, and State Senator. It is reported that the "Parking Meter Deal" is being revisited. The consortium that purchased the city's parking meters for an outrageously low price in 2008, has now put them up for sale. However, to repurchase the meters, the city would have to take out a high interest loan that would negatively impact our credit rating and raise costs for future borrowing. Hopefully, the powers that be will see this danger. A reminder that Alderman Waguespack was one of only 5 aldermen to vote against this terrible deal. "Thank you" Scott for your common sense and good judgement.

ICE allegedly will return to Chicago in the spring. There were a few incidents in Lakeview in the fall where individuals were wrongly arrested and with ICE indiscriminately using teargas. Be prepared and be careful. Actions by ICE in Minneapolis have been tragic. If they return to Lakeview, protest, but do it peacefully. Have your whistles to warn others. Candidate Forum

The Chicagoland and Illinois statewide election primaries will take place March 17 with the runoff election to follow on Nov 4th. SLN has reviewed the political offices that have contested races and that have the most effect on the daily lives of our local residents. Those offices are State Senator[s], Cook County Assessor, Cook County Board of Commissioners President, Cook County Commissioner District 12. SLN has invited all the candidates running in their respective primaries to for these offices to briefly address our general membership as to why they should get your vote and also have some Q & A with the attendees. The following candidates for their respective offices

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have been invited with current confirmation noted:

- State Senator Dist. 6: incumbent Sara Feighenholtz and challenger Nick Uniejewski [both confirmed]
- Cook County Assessor: incumbent Fritz Kaegi [confirmed] and challenger Patrick Hynes
- Cook County Board President: incumbent Toni Preckwinkle and challenger Brendan Reilly [confirmed]
- Cook County Commissioner District 12 replacing outgoing Bridget Degnan: Jose Wilson, Isiah White and Liz Granato [all confirmed]

As in past forums, the candidates will be managed and have a limited amount of time to each talk and answer questions. This is usually a pretty fluid event, and more speakers or offices may be added depending on the allowable time and their availability. Due to space requirements this February's meeting date has been moved from the 2nd Tuesday to the 2nd **Wednesday, Feb 11**. The meeting will start at 7pm and end at 8:30pm sharp. The bar will be available before and after the forum for any candidate that wishes to have some "meet and greet" with individual attendees. This may be the only time that you have the opportunity to hear directly from our future office holders that can influence laws, taxes and regulations in our area.

Cleo's – 2826 N. Lincoln Ave.

In the former Tatas Tacos site, Cleo's is open for business. Cleo's also has a space in Bronzeville

opened in 2019 and in the Loop opened in 2022. The restaurant is American Southern Cuisine and best known for its Creole-spiced fried fish and honey buttered 24-karat gold muffins. This opening was recently featured on the front page of the Chicago Tribune-Food & Health section on Wednesday, January, 21.

Panera is Coming

The shuttered Boston Market building on Ashland at Wellington has a yellow Public Notice on the door which states "Application for Special Use to allow for one story restaurant (PANERA) with drive thru." The application was dated November 25, 2025 by Panera, LLC.

Dear Margaret (DM's) – 2965 N. Lincoln

Closed since the October 6, 2025 fire, this award-winning restaurant is permanently closed at this site, as the building is being sold for Demolition and Redevelopment. However, SLN reports that DM is looking at a space nearby its current location. Keep your fingers crossed.

Crimes

Dunkin Donuts (Ashland/Wellington) robbed at gun point- January 3, 2026

As reported to Bill Haderlein by the Dunkin Donut manager.

On Saturday morning, January 3 at approximately 5:45AM, after the credit card they were using was denied at the drive-thru window, two black perpetrators entered Dunkin with masks on and guns drawn, jumped over the counter and put their guns in manager's face, screaming out orders to empty the cash registers. The two felons also threatened to shoot a female patron who was in Dunkin at the time if she moved. The two robbers escaped with a cash register and cash register contents. At this time, CPD has examined the security cameras, but no arrests have been made.

Here is a Review of some of issues tackled by the Council in 2025

1) Parking Alternative Response Team- data revealed that about 10% of 911 calls in the 19th

District were for parking violations. The Council Plan would be to have the Department of Finance handle these non-violent calls, speeding up response times and optimizing police resources. Ordinance has been introduced to the City Council.

2) Created educational and advocacy resources to protect and expand the current CARE (Crisis Assistance Response Engagement) supporting mental health crisis support in dealing with 911 calls that can be deescalated with the help of professional mental health assistance

3) ICE enforcement- worked with community organizations to discuss the legal limits between local and federal enforcement and to present a “know your rights” training program.

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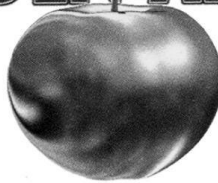

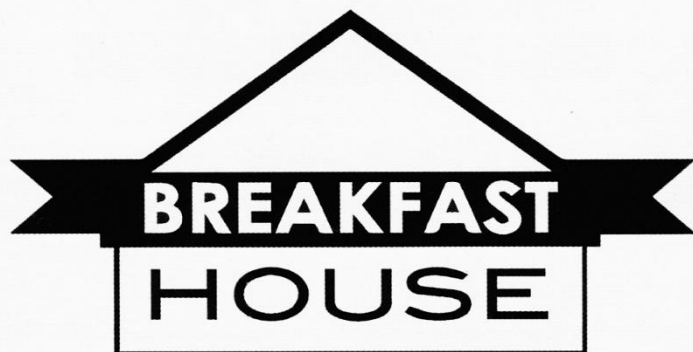
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
