AT THE MARCH 2022 ZOOM MEETING

State Senator Sara Feigenholtz

This was the State Senator's second appearance before the SLN membership since her recent election. Both by ZOOM due to the Pandemic.

Ms. Feigenholtz felt the biggest piece of legislation passed this year was the Clean Energy Jobs Act. The Act will eliminate coal usage by 2050 and convert the State's vehicles to electric.

City Crime has been more of a Mayoral and Aldermanic issue over the years, but the Senator acknowledged that Crime and the rise in gun violence is a main issue for her area. She has been meeting regularly with the Mayor and Area Police Commanders. The decrease in the number of police from attrition due to retirement or quitting will be hard to solve. As it will take time to replace the leaving officers, she feels it is best to do whatever can be done now. With that in mind, she is working on a Bill to bring more cameras into the area. Though the cameras do not necessarily reduce crime, the Commanders have indicated that they help in the crime solving. She is and has been scheduling car-jacking seminars. Ms. Feigenholtz feels that State revenue generated by cannabis sales tax should be allocated to City and State areas that are in need of immediate help regarding, crime, jobs and education.

The State Senator lauded the Budget put together in Springfield by the Governor and the Legislature. Pension Debt was paid down and a "Rainy Day" Fund has been reestablished. The Budget plan is to return money families by reducing grocery taxes, gas taxes and giving real estate tax rebates. For small businesses there may be waivers of license fees. Pandemic money from the Federal government has aided the State's budget process.

Ms. Feigenholtz noted that the Pandemic has caused an increase in mental health issues, suicides and drug addictions. The State has appointed a Behavior Health Officer to address these situations. She noted that there has been an increase in people seeking help for mental health issues. Being able to meet via ZOOM has made it more convenient and reduced the stigma of actually going to a Mental Health Office.

Other issues the State Senator has been or is currently working on:

Affordable Housing Bill – working on bringing more Affordable Housing Units in new multi-unit construction buildings. Lathrop Homes is an example. SLN has seen most developers in our area opting to pay into a Fund for this issue versus allocating Units for Affordable Housing

Small Businesses – The Senator chairs the Tourism and Hospitality Committee. She worked on getting "cocktails to go" during the Pandemic which helped restaurants and bars. The hotel and lodging industry did not receive federal funds during the Pandemic. Many of these businesses are in danger of closing. She is working on a bill to get more American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) funds allocated to the hotel and lodging industry.

Crime -

Car-jacking - she is working on legislation to address weaknesses in the current laws prosecuting offenders including juveniles committing the crimes.

Organized Retail Crime – as we know is on the increase. Legislation being worked on to address the newer crime phenomenon.

Cameras - looking to place cameras on Lake Shore Drive and other places that the Police identify as "hot spots" for crime.

Car Emission Testing – she is working on a Bill to get emission testing back within the Chicago City limits. The testing sites were closed during Governor Rauner's administration and in her opinion have created a burden for Chicago residents. There has been push back from the Illinois EPA on this issue. But the Senator noted that the method of testing is different than in the past (in case you have not had to drive out to Skokie for a recent test).

Education – CPS schools lost students during the Pandemic to private and parochial schools due to in person teaching and strike issues. The downside is that funding to the CPS schools will decrease based on enrollment.

2022 is an election year for the State of Illinois State Senate. The primary election is to be held in June 2022 and the general election will be in November 2022.

Development Updates

SLN reviewed Projects now in Progress

3015-17 N. Lincoln Ave conversion to Business Headquarters – construction has begun on converting this Property from the former Char-Crust/Lakeview Lofts Building to the new headquarters for the Human Capital Research Corporation (HCRC). HCRC is moving its office from Evanston to Lakeview. HCRC expects to have 30-45 employees working from this building. The Owner of HCRC is incorporating a "city apartment" for himself into the new construction. The alley behind the building on Southport is now blocked off for the construction.

HCRC is a \$9 million company that provides strategic and tactical information to college and university leaders, administrators and policy makers.

This Zoning change issue appeared before the SLN membership at the April 2021 ZOOM Meeting.

Wolfram and Paulina – 18 Single Family Homes

The vacant land has been cleared. Whatever foundations that were in the ground from way-back-when have been dug up and the first two houses are being built.

This Zoning change issue appeared before the SLN membership at the May 2021 ZOOM Meeting.

3150 N. Racine – BelRay Apartments SRO Project approved

The Chicago Plan Commission approved plans for the expansion of the BelRay Apartments SRO at Belmont and Racine. The final plans call for reducing the current building's number of units from 70 to 51 and constructing a new 4-story building in the adjacent parking lot with 35 units totaling 86 units.

The Plan presented to the SLN membership had 106 units. This issue (not a Zoning Change request) appeared before the SLN membership at the February 2019 Meeting.

Business Updates

NorthShore University HealthSystem Outpatient Physicians Office – 3122 N. Ashland. NOW OPEN. The Outpatient Physicians Office held their Grand Opening on Friday, April 1. The space, which was vacant for years and was an eyesore for the neighborhood has been totally gut-rehabbed and the outside has been totally redone. Welcome to the neighborhood.

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


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
